Save Our Mangroves Now! (SOMN), an initiative by the German Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), IUCN and WWF, will host a high-level reception at the German Mission in NY, New York, on the sidelines of the High Level Political Forum. The event will focus on the contribution of mangrove ecosystems towards both SDG13 and SDG8 and will showcase the role of mangroves for climate mitigation, adaptation, and economic development. Moreover, we will set out the opportunities at international and national levels to deliver transformational and measurable change by conserving and increasing mangrove coverage worldwide by 2030.
